What is inside Charley's refrigerator when Maisy visits? Nothing – it's empty!

Where do Maisy and Charley put their groceries? In their shopping cart.

Why is it a good thing that Maisy brought her wagon? It's good because now Maisy and Charley have a way to carry their groceries home.

How do Maisy and Charley feel when they finally get to eat lunch? Happy – hooray!

- 2) While reading expand vocabulary: introduce 8-10 words to highlight and define (show pictures & act out).

Fourth and Fifth Read-alouds

- 1) Before reading encourage children to recall characters, problem and solution.
 - (a) Characters -
 - (i) Do you remember who this story is about? Maisy and Charley, a mouse and an alligator who are friends.
 - (ii) Do they have any other friends? They have a panda friend who goes grocery shopping with them.
 - (iii) Who else do they see at the grocery store? The ostrich at the grocery check out.
 - (b) Problem -
 - (i) How do Maisy and Charley decide they need to buy food? Their fridge is empty.
 - (ii) How does an empty fridge make them feel? Hungry.
 - (iii) Maisy and Charley buy a lot of groceries. How do they get them home? They attach a trailer to Maisy's tricycle and she pulls the grocery bags home behind her. Charley puts some of the groceries in the basket on his bicycle.

2) While reading - expand vocabulary by introducing 8-10 words to highlight and define (show pictures & act out).

- (c) What do you think it would be like to work at the checkout of a grocery store, like the ostrich? Would standing up for so long make you tired? Would it make you happy to see your customers?
- (d) How do you think Maisy and Charley feel when they finally get to sit down for lunch? Happy, because they aren't hungry anymore.

4) Guide children to retell the story. Read pages between retellings. Ask questions that help children recall events of the story and explain what characters are thinking and feeling.

- (a) Why do Maisy and Charley go to the grocery store? It's lunchtime, but Charley's fridge is empty.
- (b) How do they get to the store? Maisy rides a tricycle, and Charley rides a bicycle.
- (c) What do Maisy and Charley buy at the grocery store? Apples, bananas, juice, bread, tomatoes, cheese and yogurt.
- (d) Who else rides in their shopping cart? The little panda.

- (e) What kind of animal works at the checkout? An ostrich. What is the ostrich's job? To take money from customers, and to pack the groceries in grocery bags.
- (f) How do Maisy and Charley get all of their groceries home? They put them in a trailer attached to Maisy's tricycle, and in Charley's bike cart.
- (g) What do Maisy and Charley do first when they get home? Unpack the groceries. What do they do second? Sit down for lunch, finally!

5) After reading - invite explanations, wonder aloud, and ask follow-up questions.

- (a) Maisy and Charley bought bananas, apples, juice, yogurt, bread, cheese and tomatoes at the grocery store. Do you think that sounds like a delicious lunch? What would you make for lunch?
- (b) When Maisy and Charley get home from shopping, they have to unpack the grocery bags. What foods do you think go in the fridge?
- (c) What's your favorite thing to get at the grocery store?
