| 24 months/ 2 years | Two-word phrases | Go store./ Mama shoes. |

| | Point to objects when named | Point to the bus. / Show me the cup. |
| 36 months/ 3 years | Three-word phrases | Big dog go./ Papa play ball. |
| | Asks for items by name | I want cracker. |
| | Is understood by a stranger 50-75% of the time | |
| | Follows two-part instructions | Get your shoes and bring them to me./ Pick up your toy and put it in the box. |
| | Uses sounds "p, b, m, n, h, w" | |
| 48 months/ 4 years | Express feelings | I'm happy./ That made me mad. |
| | Use four- to five-word phrases | I want the big truck./ Can I have water? |
| | Follow two- and three-part instructions | Point to the cat, the dog, and the mouse./ Pick up the book and put it on the table. |
| | Uses sounds "k, g, d, t, f, y" | |
| 60 months/ | Able to tell a personal story about what happened at school, friend's house, etc. | |
| 5 years | Uses four- to eight- word sentences | I want the green ball. |
| | May begin to use sounds "r, l, s, th" | |



Parallel Talk:

Talk about what you or your child are doing whenever you are together.

Examples:

- o "I'm cooking dinner. I'm stirring the pot. This is my spoon. You have a spoon, too!"
- "Let's take a bath. The water is warm. You're all wet! We need some soap. Rub rub!"

Playing together:

- Imaginary play encourages the use of language, listening, and turn taking.
 - Play pretend by using everyday items as something else during play.

Example: Using a spoon as a telephone to call a sibling, a flashlight to search a bear cave in the bedroom, or as a paddle in a rowboat.
