  - (e) What is Dr. Green doing here? She's seeing how much Biscuit weighs.
  - (f) Why is the girl telling Biscuit to be quiet? Because Dr. Green needs to hear his heartbeat.
  - (g) Why does Biscuit get a special treat? Because he was good at the vet.
  - (h) What treat did Biscuit get? A dog biscuit.
  - (i) How did he tell Dr. Green "thank you"? He gave her a big kiss (or lick).
  - (j) What does Biscuit find when he runs off at the vet's office? He finds a basket full of kittens.
- 5) After reading invite explanations, wonder aloud, and ask follow-up questions.
  - (a) Do you have any pets?
  - (b) Have you ever been to the doctor's office? Did you get a shot when you were there? Did they look at your teeth? Were you weighed and measured? Did they look at your paws?
  - (c) Did you get a treat after going to the doctor's office? If so, what was it?
  - (d) How did you feel before you went to the doctor's office? What about after how did you feel then?
  - (e) Have you ever been to the veterinarian?
