Little Gorilla – Thursday and Friday

Fourth & Fifth Read-Alouds

- 1) Before reading encourage children to recall characters, problem and solution.
 - (a) Characters -
 - (i) Do you remember who this story is about? Little Gorilla. Where does Little Gorilla live? He lives in a forest. Why kinds of animals are Little Gorilla's friends?
 - (ii) What happens to Little Gorilla? He grows very big! How does this make him feel? Sad and confused.
 - (iii) What do Little Gorilla's friends do for him after he grows so big? They have a birthday party for him. They sing "Happy Birthday," and bring him a cake.
 - (iv) How does it make Little Gorilla feel when all of his friends sing to him? Happy, because he knows they love him no matter how big or small he is.
 - (b) Problem -
 - (i) The main problem in this story was that Little Gorilla grew up and became very big, and he didn't know why he was growing. He was growing bigger because he was getting older – and it was his birthday, so Little Gorilla's friends surprised him with a birthday cake and sang him "Happy Birthday," and Little Gorilla was happy because he knew his friends still loved him.
- 2) While reading expand vocabulary by introducing 8-10 words to highlight and define (show pictures & act out).

- 3) After reading ask questions and comment on character's thoughts, feelings, and actions.
 - (a) Little Gorilla has so many friends! How do you think that makes him feel? Happy.
 - (b) How do you think Little Gorilla feels when he grows bigger and bigger? Sad and confused.
 - (c) Little Gorilla is surprised when his friends bring him a birthday cake and sing him "Happy Birthday"! He didn't know it was his birthday. How do you think Little Gorilla feels at his birthday party? Happy.
- 4) Guide children to retell the story. Read pages between retellings. Ask questions that help children recall events of the story and explain what characters are thinking and feeling.
 - (a) Who is this? It's Little Gorilla. What kinds of animal friends does Little Gorilla have? Do you remember?
 - (b) Which friends are in these trees? Green Parrot and Red Monkey.
 - (c) Oh, do you remember what kind of animal a boa constrictor is? A snake.
 - (d) What are the elephants doing to Little Gorilla? Washing him!

- (e) What kind of sound does a Lion make? Is Lion loud or quiet? His roar is loud.
- (f) How does Little Gorilla look like he's feeling when he gets big? Sad.
- (g) Why was Little Gorilla growing so big? He was getting older, and when you get older, you grow bigger.
- (h) How does Little Gorilla feel at the end of the story? Happy.

5) After reading - invite explanations, wonder aloud, and ask follow-up questions.

- (a) Where do the animals in this story live? In the forest.
- (b) Do you remember the name of the place where we can go look at animals in San Diego? The Zoo.
- (c) Have you ever been to the zoo? What kind of animals did you see (or, what kind of animals would you like to see)?
- (d) A zookeeper is a person who takes care of the animals at a zoo. Do you think that sounds like a fun job?
